



Prefabricated Spinal Orthosis

For a prefabricated lumbo-sacral-orthosis (LSO) or thoraco-lumbo-sacral-orthosis (TLSO) to be covered by Medicare, all applicable Medicare statutory and regulatory requirements must be met. This includes of the following:

- Documentation of a face to face appointment with the patient within six months of the written order.
- Letters of medical necessity are not accepted, Medicare does not consider a letter part of the medical record.
- All notes need to contain the physician's printed name, signature, patient name and date.
- Stamped, illegible signatures or notes are not accepted.
- Addendums need to be added to the prescribing physician

The physician must also document AND DISCUSS at least one of the following:

- The orthosis is medically necessary to reduce pain by restricting mobility of the trunk; ***or***
- The orthosis is medically necessary to facilitate healing following an injury to the spine or related soft tissues; ***or***
- The orthosis is medically necessary to facilitate healing following a surgical procedure of the spine or related soft tissues; ***or***
- The orthosis is medically necessary to otherwise support weak spinal muscles and/or a deformed spine.
